

COVID-19 DHS Provider Meeting March 25, 2020

As of the time of this meeting, 3-25-2020 at 4:30pm, there are 88 confirmed cases and 2 deaths in the County.

- United Way's Covid-19 volunteer website will be online soon.
 - It will be promoted on social media and we will include it in our updates.
- As of now, United Way has only identified a handful of volunteer opportunities.
 - \circ We hope to identify more opportunities from responses to the food survey.
 - We have heard from a number of organizations and individuals interested in helping.
 - We are focusing on basic needs.
- United Way is also posting virtual volunteer events.

Legislative/Policy Updates

As a reminder, your work is exempt from the stay-at-home order because it is essential to health and human services for the region.

- You've all received a letter from Marc Cherna stating that you are doing essential work and thus exempt from the order.
 - Please keep a copy of this letter available at your offices and share it with staff electronically so they can present it should they be stopped while driving.

The "Phase 3" Stimulus legislation is pending, with Senate and house votes scheduled for this afternoon and tomorrow (3/26).

More than half a million Pennsylvanians have filed new unemployment claims during the past week.

• A bill expected to pass the PA House will pay anyone employed by a public school as if the pandemic had not occurred. Senate expected to vote on bill later today, 3/25/2020.

Gov. Wolf and lawmakers are discussing a possible emergency relief hospital fund to be administered by the Department of Health, but no agreement has been reached yet.

An attempt by 5 members of Allegheny Council to change jail rules to release inmates was defeated.

Food

We are focusing on developing mechanisms to get food closer to people, contingency plans for sites that must close, meeting additional demand and developing/implementing food-related processes for families in quarantine.

- We are working closely with the United Way and the foundation community to devise solutions.
- We are also working on a solution for the diaper and formula shortage.

We continue to encourage you to use the <u>Food distribution map as the</u> most updated source of information.

- The map is located in the food section of the website.
- The map allows you to make corrections and submit additional food sites.
- Please email us if you have a new site (address) or are aware of a site that's not distributing food.
- Please feel free to blast it to your networks.

AAA food information

- Requests for food for seniors are increasing, but we are still within our capacity to deliver these meals.
- We were able to put in an order for more shelf stable items.
- We are collecting the names of volunteers to share with providers who have a need.
 - Volunteers with clearances are preferred.

Program Updates

AAA

- We have been getting reports of a considerable number of scamming calls related to COVID-19.
 - One phone scam involves people claiming to be from the CDC and requesting banking/credit card information.
 - If you hear of any scamming calls, please contact the Senior Line at 412-350-5460.
 - Please advise any seniors you know about the danger of this and other scams.

 - Childcare for essential employees:

 - There are currently about 250 open slots around the county
 - More providers are standing by to address additional demand.

 - All services are virtual or via telephone.

 - The Mon Valley Initiative is available to assist displaced workers.
 - MVI is currently conducting intakes and assisting individuals remotely.

 - Homeless network:
 - We are continuing to work on isolation and quarantine space.
 - Facility 1 (single room occupancy for homeless individuals currently in shelter or on the streets) will be open within the next week.
 - Next week only the provider call will be on a different day/time, Wednesday April 1st at 9:30am. See slide for call-in information.

Behavioral Health

- We are monitoring supplies and staffing. So far, we have seen no adverse impact on services.
- A BH provider meeting is scheduled for Thursday, 3/26 at 10am. This will take place weekly on Thursdays going forward (starting 4/2/2020) from 10-11am.
- We are modifying our intake forms to reflect the requirement for all providers to report client illness.
- Drug and Alcohol
 - Certified Assessment Centers (CACs) will not open on 4/1 as scheduled.
 - Level of care assessments are still available as usual.
 - At this time, we have no reports of decreases in intake for drug and alcohol services.
 - Residential providers now have the option to flex beds. Contact DDAP licensing directly for more information.
 - Annual monitoring is being postponed and will be rescheduled after the crisis.
- Mental Health
 - All Mental Health commitment hearings are being conducted via audio.
 - Contact IRES Manager Michael Rocco at 412-350-4456 with questions.

- All affected facilities have been notified.
- We are working on ways to continue to provide social rehabilitation supports.
- Early intervention
 - Services are being impacted by the current crisis and we are working closely with the state and the Alliance for Infants and Toddlers to address this impact.
 - Vision, hearing and nutrition services are allowable, but tele-delivery is a challenge due to the nature of the services. We are working with providers to address this challenge.
 - Social work and nursing services are not covered.
 - Assessments and initial evaluations will be conducted via telehealth.

OID/Autism

- Providers are sending us supply needs and we are working to meet them.
- We have heard about 4 individuals and staff who have been tested for Covid-19.
 - Two came back negative and we are continuing to monitor the results
- We continue to follow local information and directives, along with information from the PA Department of Health and the State Office of Developmental Programs.

- Funding and staffing remain stable.
- Thank you to our thoughtful partners, including Beverly's Birthdays, who are meeting critical needs by helping us deliver supplies.
- Referrals have decreased by a frightening amount.
 - Please check in on children and families through teleconferencing.
 - Please reach out if you need help installing teleconferencing capability.
 - Family Links' teen healing center will open on Monday, 3/30/2020.
 - Teens who have tested positive for COVID-19 can recover there.
- We are asking providers to help us prioritize which families need to be seen.
- If you are hiring emergency staff, we can run clearances for you (except for FBI fingerprints).

Courts/Fifth Judicial District

- We continue to operate under the March 23 order detailing emergency operations.
- <u>Custody orders remain in effect</u> and are unaffected by the governor's stay-at-home order.
- Things are changing rapidly. Keep checking the <u>Fifth Judicial District of Pennsylvania website</u> daily, where you can find the March 23rd order, numbers for people to call and FAQs. It is updated daily.
