

COVID-19 DHS Provider Meeting April 7, 2020

General Information

As of the time of this meeting (4-7-2020 at 4:30 pm) there are 689 confirmed cases and 6 deaths in the County.

• Gender, age and geographic distributions of cases are available on the <u>Health Department</u> <u>website</u>.

Nicole Molinaro from Women's Center and Shelter joined the call to talk about intimate partner violence (IPV).

- About IPV
 - There are many types of abuse that fall under IPV (e.g., mental, physical, emotional, neglect)
 - Nationally, chronic IPV impacts 25% of families.
 - In a pandemic, IPV incidents increase.
 - The UN Secretary General reported a worldwide surge.
 - China saw a threefold increase.
 - Meanwhile, the ability to reach out for help decreases because people are confined to home with their partner, cut off from their social support networks and/or unable to access health care.
- Local Trends
 - IPV-related police calls have been up 20-30% (City of Pittsburgh Police).
 - PFA filings are down 23-60% (child abuse reports are down 53-63%).
 - Hotline calls are down by 30-38% (Women's Center & Shelter).
- Local Resources
 - All local IPV organizations are operating (Women's Center & Shelter, Alle-Kiski HOPE Center, Center for Victims, Crisis Center North).
 - \circ Shelters are open and hotlines/all other services are being delivered remotely.
 - Women's Center & Shelter has expanded services during the pandemic to meet increased need:
 - o Expanded outreach to those who abuse and their victims
 - Offering Zoom consultation/trainings to providers upon request,.

- Limit requests to fewer than 500 items at a time to expedite the requests; bigger requests will not get filled.
- We are hearing that most supplies (with the exception of gowns) are currently moving more reliably to ACES.

Legislative/Policy Updates

State and local updates

- 1 in 6 PA workers have now filed for unemployment.
- Republicans in the PA House have moved two bills out of committee that would re-open construction businesses and allow other small businesses to re-open in the face of Gov. Wolf's order for them to remain closed.
- Pittsburgh area banks are already lending \$191.7M in small-business loans that are NOT SBAbacked or CARES loans. No numbers yet on CARES stimulus loans as first day to apply was last Friday.
- City Parks usage is up 83% since the pandemic began.

Food

There was a spike in food-related calls to 2-1-1 yesterday. We will continue to monitor this trend.

This week is "spring break," meaning there will be some changes to school districts' food distributions.

- 412 Food Rescue is providing bus stop food distributions. Check <u>412 Food Rescue's Facebook</u> <u>page</u> for daily bus stop updates.

 - There are still open spots and we are still researching solutions for COVID-positive households.
- We have moved employment information and resources to <u>our website</u>.
- Homeless network
 - We continue to work on isolation and quarantine space.

- As a reminder, we started moving people into the safe haven hotel yesterday (4-6-2020)! This facility is for individuals who are currently in shelters and need to be isolated or quarantined. These rooms are for individuals who are highly vulnerable, have been exposed to COVID-19, or are COVID-19-positive but not in need of hospitalization. It will also be made available for first responders who are unable to return home.
- We are working to identify individuals in need of these spaces
 - We are following a strict referral process and will expand this process out to you soon.
 - We will also provide a decision tree to determine fit.
 - Please also consult with the client and make sure they want to come.
- CHS is staffing the facility and they need some staffing help on the weekend.
 - \circ Here is a <u>link to apply</u>.
 - Hired individuals will be contracted employees of CHS.
- Community Kitchen Pittsburgh is providing meals. Residents get 3 meals a day delivered to their door.
- CYF is allowing us to use their transportation team to transport people from shelters to the hotel.
- The provider call is on Tuesdays at 9:30am. Call-in information is in the slide. presentation.
- Furniture and thermometers are in demand from our providers, so we are working on those.

Courts/Jail

- On March 27, the jail announced that a staff member had a confirmed case of COVID-19.
 - That individual did not have direct inmate contact, but the jail reports that it has nonetheless stepped up its response and is implementing additional measures including active screening for fever and respiratory symptoms in staff, contractors, inmates and individuals coming into the facility at intake.
 - Overall, four staff and seven inmates have been tested; the one staff case confirmed on March 27 was the only positive one.
- As previously reported, with the Court's approval, the jail is also restricting legal visits and has set up alternative ways for individuals to communicate with their attorneys.
- Per the jail's website, the jail has also taken extra social distancing and sanitization precautions.
- Inmates continue to be allowed one free daily five-minute phone call.
- The PA Supreme Court decision on Juveniles in Detention was issued today: they denied the request to direct the reduction of the number of youth in detention, correctional and other residential facilities to prevent the spread of COVID-19. We will provide additional information as we receive it.
