General Information

As of the time of this meeting (5-4-2020 at 4:30 pm) there are 1,365 confirmed cases and 102 deaths in the County.

Legislative/Policy Updates

Federal Updates

• 5th Federal stimulus bill: Negotiations for state and local aid package are still in the early stages. No bipartisan agreement yet or clear timeline.

State and local updates

- PA reported a tax revenue loss of \$2.2 billion in April, falling 50% below official budget estimates.
 - Majority of the shortfall is due to the 3-month extension of the deadline for filing personal income taxes, which was pushed to July.
 - o But \$400 million is estimated to be lost due to pandemic.
- County Executive is coordinating with Gov. Wolf in an attempt to have Allegheny County moved to "yellow phase" of re-opening as soon as May 15th.
 - Allegheny County has been below the "fewer than 50 new confirmed cases per 100,000 population in the previous 14 days" threshold since mid-April.
 - We are working on guidance for what this means for you and your clients.

Food

The food bank shared an infographic describing their COVID-19 response.

• One million more pounds of food than usual have been distributed during COVID-19, and a large majority (3 million pounds of 4.1 million pounds total) has been distributed by partner agencies.

OCS

- For childcare resources, please share ELRC contact information (<u>elrc5@alleghenycounty.us</u> or 412-350-3577) with your essential employees.
 - O Childcare centers can reopen during the yellow phase. We are watching the PA counties who are entering the yellow phase first to learn from them.
 - o Allegheny County Family Centers are offering online programming, open to all. You can learn more on Facebook @alleghenycountyfamilysupport.
- We have moved employment information and resources to our website.
- Homeless network
 - o As a reminder, we have begun partnering with the Health Department and FQHCs to expand health services in shelters.
 - DHS is scheduling a call for shelter directors with heads of FQHCs within the next couple of weeks.
 - The Family Isolation/Quarantine space should open on Thursday 5-7-2020. More information will be shared on Thursday's provider call.
 - Safe Haven Hotel
 - To date, 52 clients have been accepted into the hotel.
 - The primary age group served has been 52-62.
 - Most clients are there because they are high-risk, based on age and chronic health conditions, but we have also served COVID-positive and quarantined folks.
 - They are overwhelmingly being referred from homeless system providers, but we are getting referrals from a diversity of sources.
 - They are mostly going to private housing upon exiting the hotel.
 - As a reminder, referrals are now accepted from homelessness shelters, street outreach providers, healthcare providers, and refugee and immigrant services.
 Any system with an individual in urgent need of safe haven should reach out to your DHS contact.

Behavioral Health

- Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) released another round of <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Changes</u>, including:
 - Expansion of Medicare coverage for audio-only phone services during the coronavirus pandemic, including psychotherapy, health behavior assessment and intervention services, and other behavioral health services.
 - o Steps to allow for temporary expansion to help address capacity.
 - Allowing payment for certain partial hospitalization services e.g., individual psychotherapy, patient education and group psychotherapy – that are delivered in temporary expansion locations, including patients' homes.
