Policy & Legislative Update – State

• The General Assembly is still figuring out how to allocate the remaining \$1.3b in federal CARES Act funds before year's end. Decisions will be part of remaining budget negotiations due by the end of November, where a \$4.5b shortfall must be accounted for.

- The state legislature did <u>not</u> move bills as expected which would:
 - create the \$200m Nonprofit Economic Emergency Delivery Systems (NEEDS)
 Grants Program using federal CARES Act funds, consideration is now expected after the election; and
 - increase the cap on emergency rental assistance for PHFA's COVID Relief-Mortgage and Rental Assistance Grant Program (HB 2868), citing the Governor's executive action earlier in the week.

Policy & Legislative Update – Local

• The Allegheny County Elections Office is expanding hours for its office and the downstairs lobby for voters to apply for and receive their mail-in or absentee ballot, or to return their completed ballot (link for hours and information on additional election offices).

 Both Pittsburgh City Council and Allegheny County Council passed bills to ban hair discrimination in employment, education, housing, and other settings.

County Council approved Juneteenth as an annual County holiday.

Food Delivery: Costs related to food delivery to vulnerable populations and in compliance with COVID-19 public health precautions;

PPE and Testing: Providing COVID-19 testing and Personal Protective Equipment;

<u>Health and Safety Messaging</u>: Reducing the spread of the coronavirus by getting tailored health and safety messages to the community, and translating messaging as needed, including information about COVID-19 and its symptoms, and CDC-recommended practices;

Working to reduce the disparate impact of the virus and its aftermath on Black, Brown, Latinx, immigrant, LGBTQIA people and communities; and

Reducing Social Isolation: Supporting safe community activities to reduce social isolation.

Response and Grants made from the Coronavirus Relief Fund

83 organizations invited

- 62 registered for information sessions, and 39 attended
- 28 applied and were funded

• Grants – a total of \$1.62 million to 28 grants

- 14 organizations with annual operating budgets under \$1,000,000, and 11 with budgets under \$500,000
- Average grant size \$57,888 (range \$1,200 to \$100,000)

PA State Metrics

- Compares this week (October 9th to October 15th) to previous week (October 2rd to October 8th). Data is updated every Friday.
- All are increasing except PCR positivity rate (which is steady) and ER visits due to COVID.
 - New cases and incidence rates per 100,000 increased slightly during this period (by 4% each).
 - However, hospitalizations continue to rise, with a 22% increase over the last week.

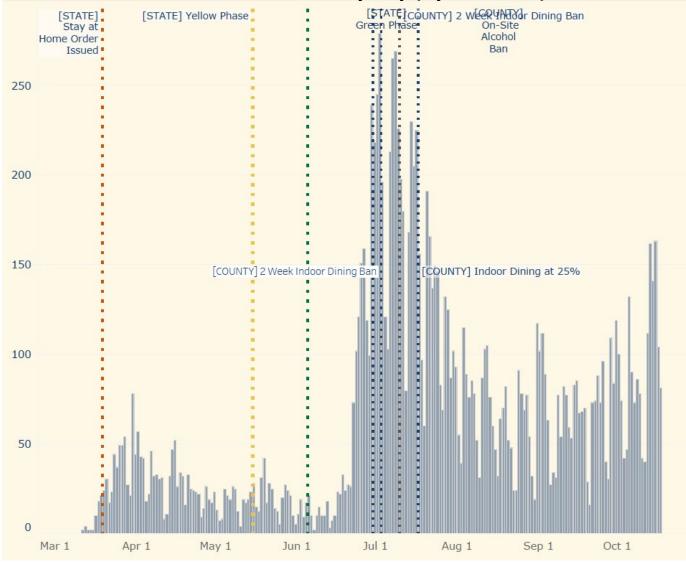

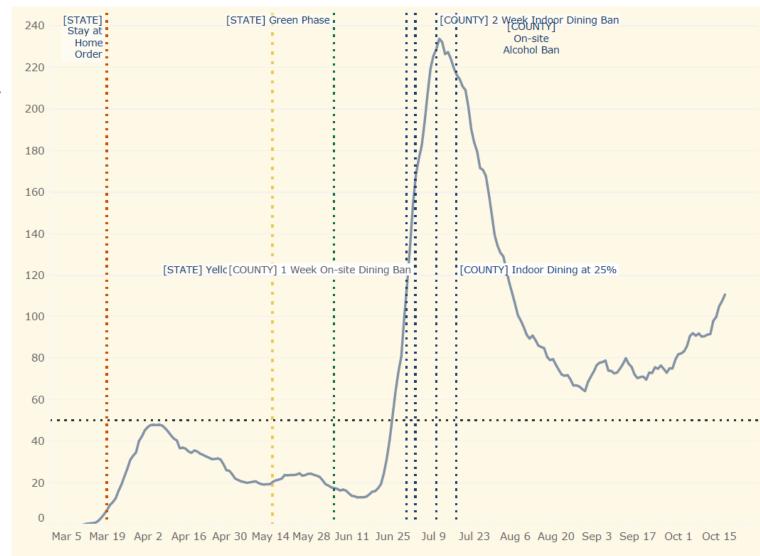


Cases per 100,000

- There were 106 total hospitalizations on October 20th (the most recent data available)

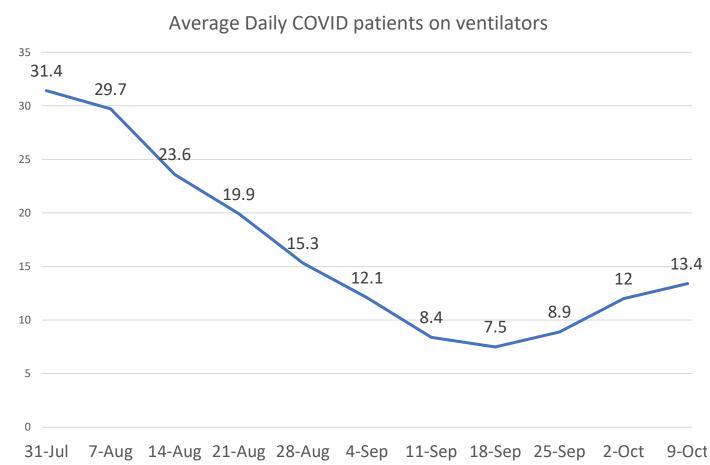

Ventilators

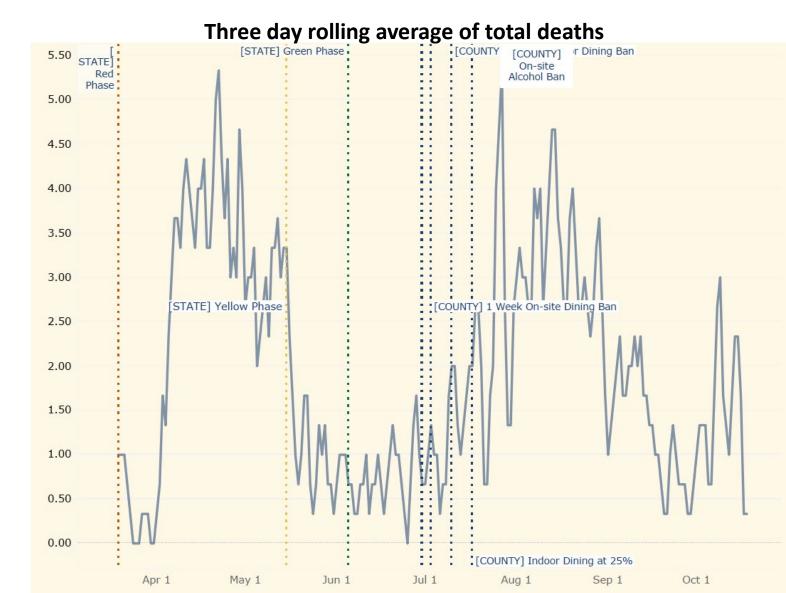
- From the week of July 31st to the week of September 18th, the average daily COVID patients on ventilators fell by 76% (31.4 to 7.5).
- Since September 18th, the average daily COVID patients on ventilators has increased by 44% (7.5 to 13.4). However, patients remain below mid-summer levels

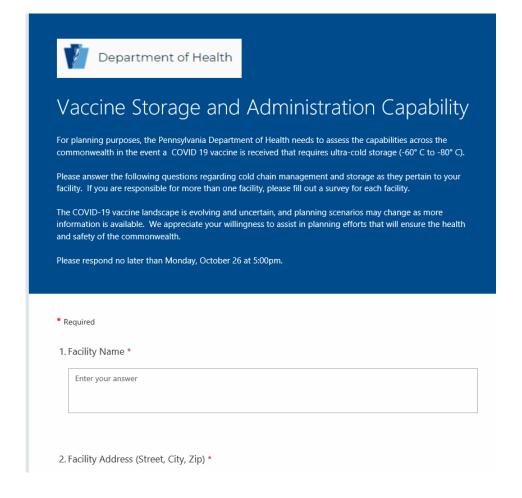

Pennie

Pennsylvania's new state-based health insurance marketplace

- What: Pennie, a state-based health insurance marketplace, is replacing the federal health exchange (healthcare.gov) for Pennsylvanians with open enrollment beginning Nov 1st.
- Why: Pennie seeks to improve the accessibility and affordability of individual market health coverage for Pennsylvanians with health insurance premiums expected to be approximately 5-10% lower than thru plans in the Federal health exchange.
- **Financial assistance**: Qualification is based on income and family composition -- individuals making less than \$50,000/year or a family of four making less than \$105,000/year are expected to qualify for financial assistance.
- **Collaboration with Medicaid**: Pennie provides seamless referral to and from Medicaid and CHIP health coverage.

Open Enrollment Period – Begins Nov 1st and runs thru Jan 15th

- The Pennie website will allow users to compare insurance plans and enroll when the inaugural open enrollment period begins November 1st.
- Pennsylvanians most impacted by the creation of Pennie are individuals and families who are:
 - covered by individual health plans through healthcare.gov and will now access coverage through Pennie;
 - without access to employer-sponsored coverage; and
 - uninsured.
- Individuals receiving health insurance via the federal exchange have been notified of the switch to Pennie.
- The state estimates that over 43,000 Pennsylvanians are uninsured (and not eligible for Medicaid).

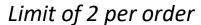

Bactronix Treatment Available

- Electrostatically applied treatment that will both disinfect and prevent the growth of microbial activity (including COVID-19) from surfaces for up to six months
- Need to vacate the space for less than one hour while treatment is applied; only need to remove personal items and paper from surfaces (safe for application on electronics)
- After application, only "eco-friendly" (non-alcohol, non-chlorine) cleaners can be used on surfaces

Bactronix Treatment Available

- We will provide some of the eco-friendly cleaning products for you to use after application
- Treatment was applied at DHS buildings no noticeable residue left behind
- Due to time and funding constraints, at this time the treatment is only available to providers at highest risk of a COVID outbreak:

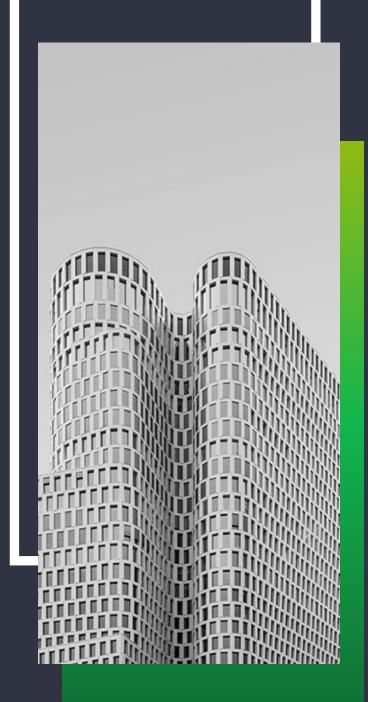

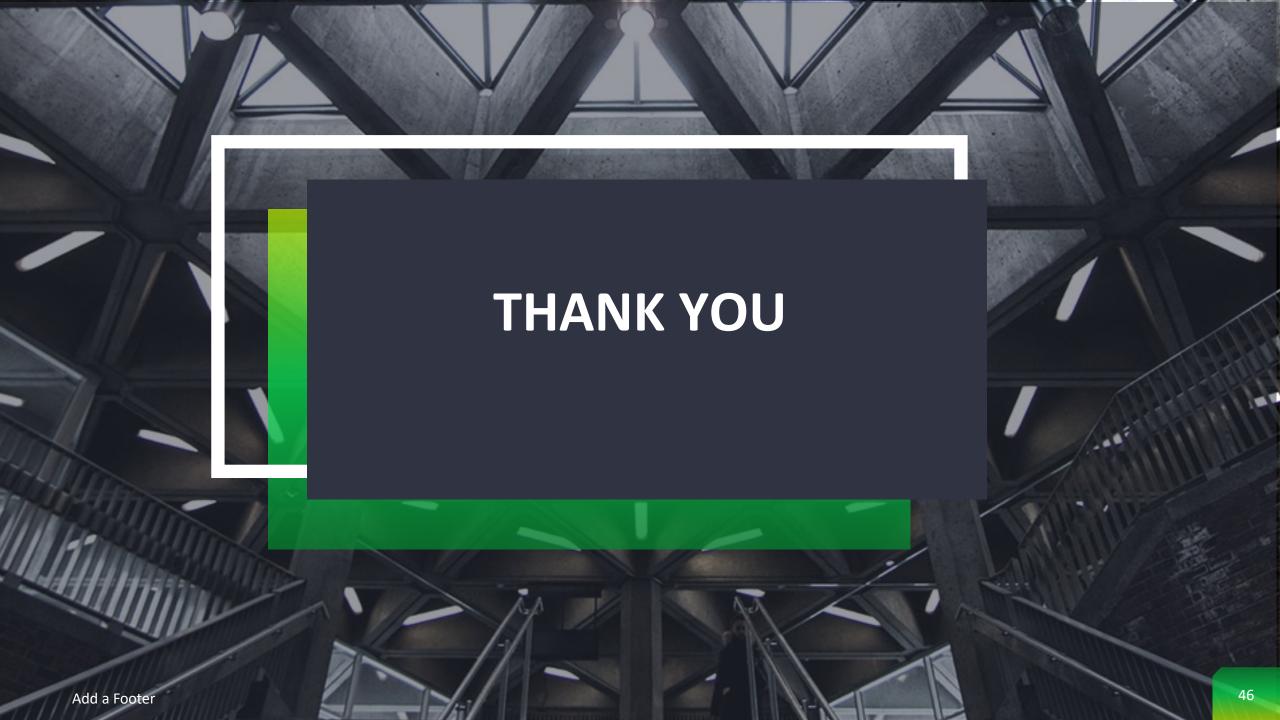

 - Barrier- there may be more than one active address
