



COVID-19 DHS Provider Meeting
March 26, 2020



General Information

As of the time of this meeting (3-26-2020 at 4:30) there are 133 confirmed cases and 2 deaths in the County.

- This spike may be attributable to expanded testing.

Supply Requests

- Allegheny County Emergency Services (ACES) will be managing all requests for hard-to-find items that cannot be obtained through normal means due to global supply chain challenges.
 - Items include: Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), such as sterile or nitrile gloves, N95 masks, gowns and hair covers, and cleaning supplies such as Clorox wipes and hand sanitizer.
 - How to request hard-to-find supplies:
 - If your agency is affiliated with a larger healthcare agency such as Mercy Behavioral Health, UPMC or Allegheny Health Network, your needs should be submitted through your parent agency via HAP, the Hospital & HealthSystem Association of Pennsylvania. Please reach out to your agency contact to submit supply requests.
 - All other providers, please complete the Allegheny County Emergency Services (ACES) Resource Request Form ([found here](#)) and email it to EMA@alleghenycounty.us. Hard-to-find supplies are being centrally coordinated through ACES and are being distributed as soon as they are available.
- For all other items, email DHS-COVID19Planning@AlleghenyCounty.us and we will do our best to help you meet your needs.
- Please only request what you really need and limit requests to supplies needed for the next two weeks.

Legislative/Policy Updates

The "Phase 3" Stimulus legislation is still pending. The Senate has passed it and the House is planning a vote on Friday 3/27.

- We will continue to provide updates on this legislation and how you will receive this funding.

Some sobering local statistics:

- 10% of the PA workforce has applied for unemployment compensation.
- The Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA) of Pittsburgh has received more than 400 applications for its low-income family grant program of \$3,000 and only has funds for 100 families. The URA is currently seeking additional funding to address this increased need.
- The City of Pittsburgh is anticipating budget deficits for the year due to revenue delays and the effect of the economic downturn on business taxes.

Food

We continue to encourage you to use the [Food distribution map as the](#) most updated source of information.

- We are getting a lot of web traffic on the map, and other sites have been linking to it.
- The map is located in the food section of the website.
- The map allows you to make corrections and submit additional food sites.

A Food Access Call was held today (3/26) and we will continue to meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

- Transportation and getting food to individuals and families are the primary topics.
 - Some of this need can be addressed by bus and with 412 Food Rescue's home delivery pilot.

- We will share the results with the United Way, all of you and other partners soon.

AAA food information

- Requests for food for seniors are increasing, but we are still within our capacity to deliver these meals.
- We are getting 30-33 new requests per day.
- We were able to put in an order for 1,000 shelf stable meals from Defense Logistics.
- We are exploring ways to locate more "everyday" supplies like toilet paper and will keep you updated.

Program Updates

AAA

- Our workers are experiencing transportation challenges with home visits due to cuts in Port Authority routes.
 - We will have an update at tomorrow's (3/27/2020) meeting.

OCS

- We have moved employment information and resources to [our website](#).
- Homeless network

- Today, a Public Source article claimed we had contracted with an airport hotel to address housing needs. This article was NOT correct and there are currently no plans to use this space.
- We continue to work on isolation and quarantine space.
 - Facility 1 (single room occupancy for homeless individuals currently in shelter or on the streets) will be open within the next week.
 - We are close to opening facilities 2 and 3.
 - Pictures of the facilities are included in today's slide presentation.
- **Next week only** the provider call will be on a different day/time, Wednesday April 1st at 9:30am. See slide for call-in information.

Behavioral Health

- We are monitoring supplies and staffing, but so far, there has been no adverse impact on ability to deliver services.
- We are maintaining our crisis services across the community.
 - ReResolve Crisis Center has a backup plan in place should staffing becomes a challenge.
- Upcoming Meetings:
 - BH provider meetings will take place weekly on Thursdays starting next Thursday, 4/2/2020, from 10-11am.
 - A Social Rehabilitation provider meeting is scheduled for tomorrow, 3/27/2020, at 1:00pm.

- Funding opportunities:
 - Earlier today (3/26/2020) we were notified of a [Staunton Farm opportunity](#) to apply for an emergency grant.
 - Check with your existing funders, as we are hearing that many are open to flexibility and re-purposing of existing grants.
- Drug and Alcohol
 - DDAP is suspending certain regulations.
 - See [Licensing Alert 02-20](#) and [Licensing Alert 03-20](#) for more details.
 - DDAP also issued a list of available resources for individuals [here](#).
 - There is an adequate supply of Narcan and kits are available for distribution.
 - We are working on backup plans to ensure continued access.
- Early intervention
 - No change since 3/25.

OID/Autism

- We continue to follow local information and directives, along with information from the PA Department of Health and the State Office of Developmental Programs.
 - ODP Announcement 20-029 is relevant to providers of residential services.
 - The state is adding more Without Day days for you to bill against, which will allow you to bill and get paid in a timely fashion.

- ODP Announcement 20-031 concerns retainer payments.
 - If you provide community participation services, the state will still reimburse you at 75% of your monthly total average of claims.

CYF

- Funding and staffing remain stable; service locations and supplies continue to be unstable.
- We are sending daily updates to staff and providers.
 - These updates include factual communication as well as inspirational and mindfulness content.

Courts/Jail

- A reminder that we continue to operate under the [March 23 order detailing emergency operations](#).
- [Safety & Justice Challenge](#) folks are continuing to identify people for release.
 - Allegheny County is also working to make sure that those who are released have a place to go.
- Matt Dugan, director of Allegheny County Office of the Public Defender (OPD), joined the call and shared the following information:
 - Arrests have decreased but are still occurring.
 - Arraignments will be staffed full time (around the clock), beginning 3/3/2020, to keep people out of the jail.
 - The judge and attorneys will conduct these arraignment remotely, via teleconference.
 - OPD continues to work with DHS to identify at-risk incarcerated clients, communicate with court partners and maintain a safe work environment for OPD staff.
 - More than 300 motions have been filed since 3/18/2020 (this is really fast).
 - More than 470 inmates have been released since 3/18/2020.
- The Allegheny County Jail has been implementing social distancing.
 - All visits have been canceled, but attorneys are able to confer with their clients by telephone.
 - Regular updates are available at the [jail operations page](#).
- The Jail is conducting health screenings, including temperature checks, and using isolation when necessary.

Transportation

- We are working with the state to coordinate care management transportation.
