

# **COVID-19 DHS Provider Meeting April 20, 2020**

#### General Information

As of the time of this meeting (4-20-2020 at 4:30 pm) there are 1,042 confirmed cases and 55 deaths in the County.

- The Health Department's <u>dashboard</u> provides additional information.
- The Hospital Association of Pennsylvania's dashboard shows information such as bed utilization.

We are working on State and County budget implications, program-specific guidance documents, a debrief of Community Listening Sessions and technology resources for clients. We hope to share those with you within the next few weeks.

#### New Supply Request Procedure

As a reminder, DHS is now partnering with Global Links for supply requests. Keep in mind that the global supply chain is disrupted for all PPE, so quantities are limited.

- To submit a request for PPE and/or General Supplies, use Global Links' online ordering form.
  - o Please limit requests to no more than what is needed during a two-week period.
  - The form is six pages in total. The form requests specific information about how the PPE will be used, such as # of clinical staff, # of clients seen daily, # of clients living in your facility and plans for appropriate use of PPE. It also includes a waiver of liability.
  - After submission, Global Links will contact you to confirm availability of the inventory within 1-2 days.
    - DHS will help prioritize supply requests and will step in if supplies are needed that Global Links cannot source.
  - o After confirmation, delivery will occur 3-5 days after the request is approved.
- Current Supply Offerings:
  - o Disposable facemasks (NOT N95 respirator masks)
  - o Emergency facemasks (reusable, not intended for clinical use)
  - o Full-face shields
  - o Gloves
  - Incontinence supplies
  - We also hope to provide diapers in partnership with the PA Diaper Bank. If you are already a member of the Diaper Bank, continue to get your diapers there.
  - o The form is updated regularly based on current availability of supplies.

PA Department of Community and Economic Development has released a <u>directory of PPE suppliers</u>.

- DHS has not vetted this directory and does not endorse any specific organization.
- Watch out for signs of a scam: Avoid pre-payment and check where the materials are currently located (make sure they are in the United States).

# Legislative/Policy Updates

Federal updates

- Congress us nearing an agreement on a \$450 billion 4th Stimulus package.
  - Possible numbers include: \$300 billion to replenish the Paycheck Protection Program;
     \$50 billion for the SBA's disaster relief fund; \$75 billion for hospitals and \$25 billion for testing.
  - o No relief included in this round for state and local governments.
  - o The Senate is planning to vote tomorrow (Tuesday, 4/21/2020) and the House on Wednesday, 4/22/2020..

#### Food

The Food Access Provider call is on Tuesdays at 3:30 pm. See slide presentation for call-in information. Here are ways to support individuals and families gain food access:

- Encourage families/individuals to apply for public assistance.
  - o The Food Bank and Just Harvest both offer application assistance.
  - Applications can be submitted online or by email. Please print out some applications to have on-hand.
  - Multi-language applications: applications in several languages can be found for printing at https://www.dhs.pa.gov/Services/Assistance/Pages/Apply-for-Benefits.aspx.
- Help families/individuals finding local sources of food:
  - Local pantries and other local emergency food options are the best options—they have fewer crowds than the large-scale Food Bank distribution.
    - Use this map or "Get Help" on the Food Bank website to identify pantries near their home.
    - Flexibilities have been put in place to allow providers to pick up for households. Call the pantry in advance for documentation requirements.
  - o Grab and Go sites are available for families with children.
    - Use <u>this map</u> or "Grab and Go" on the <u>Food Bank website</u> to identify the closest Grab and Go location.
    - Flexibilities may be in place to allow providers to pick up for households. Call the site in advance for documentation requirements.
  - Large-scale food bank distributions are only recommended for households that do not have access to a local food pantry.
  - Recommend Home Delivery only to households that are unable to get to a distribution site and whose local pantry is not offering home delivery. Call 2-1-1.
