

COVID-19 DHS Provider Meeting April 8, 2020

General Information

As of the time of this meeting (4-8-2020 at 4:30 pm) there are 720 confirmed cases and 6 deaths in the County.

• The health department released a <u>new dashboard</u> today which provides more detail and new information such as the number of tests administered.

Communicating Changes in Operations:

If you have changes in operations, continue to report that information to DHS staff. Please also use this process if you have edits/changes to what has already been reported.

Earl Buford from Partner4Work joined the call to share information about employment.

- We are convening stakeholders in nine key industries to communicate employment opportunities and forecast future needs
- Unemployment Compensation information (additional guidance from the state is expected):
 - o The CARES Act provides an additional \$600 per week to individuals receiving unemployment benefits from 3-29-2020 through 7-31-2020.
 - The PA Department of Labor & Industry (L&I) is currently modifying the UC system to issue these payments.
 - UC recipients will not need to submit additional information.
 - The CARES Act also provides up to 13 additional weeks of benefits for those exhausting UC benefits (through 12-31-2020).
 - PA L&I will update the UC website with instructions on accessing these benefits.
 - The CARES Act will provide unemployment benefits to the self-employed, independent contractors and gig workers through 12-21-2020.
 - PA L&I will provide separate filing instructions.

 - It contains information for businesses, partner organizations, workers, job seekers and youth.
 - Partner information includes training resources for workforce development providers.
 - PA CareerLink's locations are closed but are providing virtual services, including a Hot Jobs list.

 - The Commonwealth is creating a more dynamic hiring resource and CareerLink will post it once it is available.
 - PA CareerLink cannot answer most questions about UC
 - UC information can be found at the state website.
 - o Learn & Earn, the summer youth employment program, is currently recruiting.

- Limit requests to fewer than 500 items at a time to expedite the requests. Bigger requests will not get filled.
- We are hearing that supplies are moving more reliably to ACES at this time (with the exception of gowns).

Legislative/Policy Updates

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State and local updates

- Republican legislation advanced out of the Appropriations Committee in the PA House to allow more businesses to be open during the crisis (in contradiction to the orders of Gov. Wolf and the Secretary of Health).
- Pittsburgh City Council voted to extend the city's Declaration of Disaster Emergency through May 5, including stay-at-home and social distancing orders.

AAA

- While the total volume of calls has decreased slightly, the Senior Line is experiencing a higher volume of complex calls that require intensive information & assistance services.
- AAA is seeing a decrease in reports of need to Older Adult Protective Services (OAPS).
 - Emergency situations involving at-risk older adults can and are being reported to OAPS at any time, including nights and weekends.

Courts/Jail

- The Jail announced today that one inmate has tested positive for coronavirus and that the individual and their cell mate have been quarantined since the onset of symptoms.
 - Contract tracing will occur, following guidance provided by the Allegheny County Health Department.
- The PA Supreme Court <u>denied the request</u> to invoke its King's Bench authority to order the immediate presumptive release of specified categories of incarcerated persons to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in county correctional institutions.

• The same decision was made for Juvenile Detention.

Transportation

- Traveler's Aid Update
 - o Methadone Clinic transportation will continue with limited staff starting on 4-20-2020.
 - New clients will be accepted to the program
 - o Replacement gas cards and bus passes will be provided, as needed.
 - To limit contact, new Connect cards will be issued to clients instead of reloading an existing card.
 - o Traveler's Aid wil limit the number of clients in the office at a time.
