





The chart below shows the cumulative number of new people hospitalized over time per 100,000 people by race. Cases with an unknown race are not included.







### Series of Free Testing Events Scheduled Through October

The Allegheny County Health Department (ACHD) is reminding residents of a series of free COVID-19 testing events that will take place in the parking lots of faith-based organizations over the next few weeks.

The Allegheny County Health Department along Allegheny Health Network, Cornerstone Care Community Health Center, Metro Community Health Center, Northside Christian Health Center, Primary Care Health Services, Inc., Sto-Rox Family Health Center and 21 congregations representing both the Faith Based Health Collaborative of Pittsburgh, and the Pennsylvania Commonwealth Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction of the Churches of God in Christ have joined together with the Pennsylvania Department of Health for this program.

The tests are free. Prescriptions or referrals are not needed. Insurance is not needed, but those with insurance should bring their information for tracking purposes only. Pre-registration is not required.

Testing events will occur outdoors where participants may drive through or walk up. On average, the turnaround time to receive results will be two to three days after testing.







# Calculating Case Positivity Rate

- Only counts PCR tests, not antigen or antibody tests
- To calculate positivity rate for specific time period (day or week), must account for all PCR tests given during that period
- Do NOT calculate positivity rate from numbers in daily reports
  - Daily report reflects several days of testing
  - Delays in reports result in missing tests that aren't yet in NEDSS
- PA DOH COVID-19 Early Warning Monitoring System Dashboard best source of county's positivity rate
  - Currently Allegheny County 4.1% positivity rate for Oct. 16 to Oct. 22.
- Calculation for positivity rate:
  - # positive PCR tests from 7 day period X 100 = % Positivity Rate All PCR tests from same 7-day period

- 1. Flu Map: locations for flu vaccine (type, insurance, age etc...)

## Policy & Legislative Update - State and Local

- Last week, Pennsylvania's Independent Fiscal Office announced a much rosier state revenue picture than forecasted in June due to higher-than-expected consumer spending as a result of federal stimulus programs (e.g. unemployment compensation).
  - However, there's still an approximate \$2b budget hole for this fiscal year.
  - IFO highlighted how rental debt and job losses will be lingering problems for Pennsylvanians which dampens the longer-term state budget outlook without additional federal stimulus.
- The General Assembly has finished its regular legislative session without allocating the remaining \$1.3b in federal CARES Act funds. The allocation will be part of budget negotiations that must be figured out by the end of November for the rest of the current fiscal year and is expected to help fill revenue shortfall.
- Last week, Governor Wolf signed Act 83, an expansion of PA's Clean Slate law, removing an obligation to pay any outstanding court-ordered financial obligations before eligible cases can be sealed.
  - The bill also requires that a record is automatically sealed when a pardon is granted; if there's a not-guilty verdict, the record is then expunged.
- City of Pittsburgh overwhelmingly passed an amendment to their home rule charter, increasing the powers of the Citizen Police Review Board (CPRB).
  - Pittsburgh police officers can be terminated if they do not cooperate with a CPRB investigation.






### Voter Turnout for Presidential Election







# Precincts by Winner (Blue: Dem; Red: Rep)

## Voter turnout




